### What's Happening at The Monkton Community Dog Park


#### Mud Season

# Balance Training Demonstration and Workshop

### Saturday, June 5, 2021 11 AM - 1 PM

Monkton Community Dog Park Morse Park, Pond Road in Monkton

Come hear about foundational dog training from an expert! We are welcoming Alec Sparks for a demonstration and discussion of "Balance" dog training. Alec is a native Vermonter who grew up with German Shepherds; at age 13 he got his first Labrador Retriever puppy. That launched him on a life with dogs, and in 1992, in his mid-30's, he started training dogs professionally. Alec estimates some 700 dogs have received full-board training at his kennel (Snowbound Kennels in Addison) since that time. Most of these dogs spend 3½ months boarding with Alec for foundation training, and many return for advanced training as they progress in their careers.

Alec started with training retrievers for field work, then quickly moved on to training pointing breeds. These dogs were always family pets, but were also working dogs used for hunting and competition. Then over a decade ago, pet dog owners discovered Alec's successes, and introduced him to the wide range of "behavior issues" that challenged him to expand his interests. Always fascinated by all that a dog can do, Alec started working with protection dogs 5 years ago, and is currently training dogs for police canine type work.

Alec and his wife currently own a Labrador Retriever, a German Shepherd, an English Pointer, two Belgian Malinois, and a small mix-breed (two of these dogs are rescues). Alec is a big supporter of rescue operations, and is currently approved as a foster/trainer for several 501(c)3 groups. He donates long-term training for rescue dogs that are struggling with human expectations in the hope of making these dogs more adoptable. He and his wife have adopted, rescued, and re-homed, or donated long-term training, for over 40 dogs.

Alec has waived the fee for his time and work presenting this demonstration, and instead asked that your donations for this event go to a rescue operation that we have chosen with him. 100% of your donation of \$20 (suggested) will help support the work of Long Trail Canine Rescue.

The demonstration will be presented in the Morse Park-Pond Road parking lot. You may bring your dog, but please be prepared to keep the dog in your car during the demonstration, so that we can hear and pay attention to it. Alec suggests that if you do bring your pup, that you have a crate in the car so your dog can stay comfortably kenneled with the windows and doors open for air flow and temperature control during his presentation.







### A Reminder:

## MONKTON COMMUNITY DOG PARK WELCOME!

### Please read and understand all dog park rules before using the dog park.

- Dogs must be licensed, vaccinated and healthy
- Dogs must be kept in sight and under voice control at all times
- Limit: 2 dogs per adult
- Minimize excessive barking
- Dogs in heat and dogs under the age of 12 weeks are prohibited
- Pick up your dog's waste and dispose of it properly
- Dogs that display aggression toward people/dogs must be removed immediately
- Children under 12 must be supervised by an adult
- Keep your dog from jumping on other dogs or people
- Owners are legally responsible for their dogs and any injuries caused by them
- No glass, food, alcohol, or smoking all other Morse Park rules apply

Hours of Operation: The Park will be open from dawn to dusk.
