The Monkton Community Dog Park is now a full 2 years old! On Nov. 21, 2020, we tentatively opened the dog park under the state emergency (Covid) authorization, which allowed outdoor activities with plenty of social distancing. The dogs were thrilled, and so were their owners who were desperate for safe outdoor activities to keep the dogs exercised. In May of 2021, we held our official Grand Opening, and here we are, looking back on two years of operation, and planning our second Anniversary Celebration.

A Seasonal Perspective on Running a Dog Park: Remember Mud Season?

In the late spring of 2022, we put up a snow fence to keep the dogs out of the mud. We reseeded the entire fenced-off area, and by mid-summer the grass had sprouted well, and we were able to take the fence down. Actually, we are thankful to Andrew Peterson and friends who did this voluntarily, and carefully stored the materials away for re-use when needed. Next spring, we hope to use a more robust seed mix, and make some headway against the happy muddy dogs who like to create and roll in mud puddles.

While we wait for Mud Season to roll around again, we get to enjoy the beauty of Winter.



Please help us keep the gates open!

Pups and people love the snow, but our gates can be damaged when pushed through heavy snow.

If you arrive and notice that the entry gates have not been cleared, please take a few minutes to shovel before you walk on the snow and pack it down.



This will help us keep the gates in good shape for the rest of the year!



Are you ready for Winter?

It won't be long before the ground is frozen and the wallows are full of snow. Everyone who enjoys the park can help keep the gates open by spending a few minutes shoveling the snow around the entry gates if you arrive while it is still fresh and soft. Once it is packed down, it can be impossible to dig it out, and the gates can freeze closed

We will post our "Winter Weather Advisory" at the Park and on our Facebook page when winter really arrives, and we will put the shovels out for everyone to pitch in. Thanks so much for helping keep your dog park open!



Coming Soon!

Yes, we will have a Shade Structure! Despite many fits and starts, a team has come together to pick up the lagging Shade Structure project and get it done! Andrew Peterson-stepped forward and volunteered to make the Shade Structure happens. He organized a team, pulling together resources within the Dog Park community, and got the project permitted and planned. Andrew has been joined by Bob Wahl and Paul Low, to provide construction skills, equipment, and expertise and Sam Peisch has volunteered to provide cheerful support at all stages of the project. On Dec. 1, Paul Low and Bob Wahl brought in their equipment and crews, and poured the footings, hurray! Next, when the weather allows, above-ground construction will start. By the time the summer days get hot, we will have a place to cool off.

To review, in the early summer of 2021 archaeologist Scott Dillon returned to the Dog Park with a small crew from the Department of Historic Preservation to ensure that no artefacts would be lost when we sink the posts for our newest project. To date the project has gained the approval of the Monkton Rec Committee, The Vermont Housing Conservation Board, and the Vermont Division of Historic Preservation, and the Monkton Development Review Board and Zoning Administrator.

We are already planning next year's anniversary celebration, and have some great ideas for it. Jolene will return with her amazing maple sap planters, and we have a few surprises in store for you all as well. Stay tuned to hear more as our plans come together!



A Reminder:

MONKTON COMMUNITY DOG PARK WELCOME!

Please read and understand all dog park rules before using the dog park.

Dogs must be licensed, vaccinated and healthy

Dogs must be kept in sight and under voice control at all times

Limit: 2 dogs per adult

Minimize excessive barking

Dogs in heat and dogs under the age of 12 weeks are prohibited

Pick up your dog's waste and dispose of it properly

Dogs that display aggression toward people/dogs must be removed

immediately

Children under 12 must be supervised by an adult

Keep your dog from jumping on other dogs or people

Owners are legally responsible for their dogs and any injuries caused by

them

No glass, food, alcohol, or smoking - all other Morse Park rules apply

Hours of Operation: The Park will be open from dawn to dusk.

We all want the beautiful grassy field to stay beautiful and grassy, and this involves mowing and trimming along the fenceline. Again, this is a significant expense. Our goal is to never have to burden the Monkton taxpayer with any costs related to the dog park, so we will continue to look to our supporters for funding for these on-going expenses. Here are some ideas on how to help:
