The Monkton Community Dog Park is now a full 4 years old! We opened quietly on Nov. 21, 2020, in the early days of the pandemic, then in May of 2021, we held our official Grand Opening. This fall, we marked four years of happy dogs and happy owners, and in the spring of 2025, we'll host our fourth Anniversary Celebration.

We Built a Gazebo!

Red Schoolhouse Contracting and Wahl Landscaping have built a beautiful and solid hexagonal roofed shelter, with 8-foot-wide sides that gives instant relief from the hot summer sun. Paul and Bob generously donated much of the labor, and the materials costs were mostly covered by our donors, with a matching grant from the Vermont Buildings and General Services Recreational Grant Program. The Monkton Recreation Committee, recognizing the value the Dog Park and this gazebo add to Morse Park, requested that the Selectboard approve the use of federal ARPA funds for the balance of the costs expended. Thank you, MRC!



We moved one of our benches into the gazebo to allow people to relax in the shade while watching their dogs play. This spring Paul Low added a hand-carved dog wind vane, and Bob Radler and Doug Schmidt shoveled wood chips donated by new Monkcton residents (welcome!) Gillian Epler and Harry Mead to the shady area to finish off the project.

Special Recognition

This fall, the Monkton Community Dog Park Committee dedicated the gazebo to Paul Low, who donated his and his crew's time and labor to building the gazebo that we have all enjoyed through the hot summer days. We presented a plaque made by Monkton's own Wooden Hammer (thank you Ben Raphael!) during a meeting of the



Monkton Recreation Committee. You can see the plaque hanging in the gazebo anytime you visit the dog park.

A big THANK YOU to the State of Vermont and the federal ARPA program, the Town of Monkton, and the Vermont Buildings and General Services Recreational Grant Program.

The ability to apply for and receive \$5,250 in ARPA funds for this project has enabled us to pay off the balance of the project and has placed the MCDP on solid financial footing allowing us to remain focused on raising the funds needed to keep the park up and running smoothly.



A Seasonal Perspective on Running a Dog Park: Remember Mud Season?

We are making progress on getting grass to grow in what started out as mud wallows. Last year, we raked up the bark mulch in the wallows, then fertilized and reseeded the area that was doing poorly with a tough, hardy seed mix. We put up snow fence to let the grass grow and by mid-summer the grass had sprouted well, so we were able to take the fence down. The new grass grew beautifully. Thank you Nora Woolf for the introduction to Oliver's Seeds in Milton!



In the spring of 2024, we were able to halve the area that we reseeded. Our faithful dog park regular Kip brought over his seeder and spread grass seed, and we over-seeded that with the same tough mix we used last year. By fall, it was clear that this was a winning combination. A few low-lying spots remained stubbornly bare, but with the addition of a little good soil, and another year of light seeding, we should be able to keep all areas of the dog park open throughout the year.

While we wait for Mud Season to roll around again, we get to enjoy the beauty of Winter.

Are you ready for Winter?

It won't be long before the ground is fully frozen and the serious snow arrives. Everyone who enjoys the park can help keep the gates working by

spending a few minutes shoveling the snow around the entry gates if you arrive while it is still fresh and soft. Once it is packed down, it can be impossible to dig it out, and the gates can freeze closed.

We will post our "Winter Weather Advisory" at the Park and on our Facebook page when winter really arrives, and we will put the shovels out for everyone to pitch in.

Sneeze Season Reminder

Veterinarians in are reporting early spread of kennel cough and other respiratory viruses, particularly in dogs that spend time in close quarters with other dogs, such as in kennels and dog parks. Please remember the hard lessons we have learned from our own encounter with a respiratory pandemic, and keep your dog home if they are exhibiting signs of a respiratory illness -- a cough, sneezing, runny eyes or nose, fever, and/or lethargy. Call your vet, and please keep your dog isolated until they're better!



A Reminder:

MONKTON COMMUNITY DOG PARK WELCOME!

Please read and understand all dog park rules before using the dog park.

Dogs must be licensed, vaccinated and healthy

Dogs must be kept in sight and under voice control at all times

Limit: 2 dogs per adult

Minimize excessive barking

Dogs in heat and dogs under the age of 12 weeks are prohibited

Pick up your dog's waste and dispose of it properly

Dogs that display aggression toward people/dogs must be removed immediately

Children under 12 must be supervised by an adult

Keep your dog from jumping on other dogs or people

Owners are legally responsible for their dogs and any injuries caused by them

No glass, food, alcohol, or smoking - all other Morse Park rules apply

Hours of Operation: The Park will be open from dawn to dusk.
In an emergency, please call 911.
